

More Mixed Farming — Three Roads to Handle the Grain

Calgary, July 11-Two weeks of pracically steady rainfall followed by fine, has given crops in Alberta such an impetus that, despite the late spring season, all kinds of grain are far in advance of last year, and another bumper yield should be harvested in this province this

has given crops in Alberta such an impetus that, despite the late spring season, all kinds of grain are far in advance of last year, and another bumper yield should be harvested in this province this fall.

There is practically little or no difference in the acreage sown to the different grains this year, some districts showing an increase while others record a decrease. The tendency of farmers and ranchers in the southern part of the province to follow mixed farming is very marked, which is considered a very hopeful sign by local agriculturists. The campaign to educate new settlers in Alberta not to put all their land in grain, has been waged with varying success for the last few years, but not until this year have the farmers responded to the appeals of the department of agriculture with any show of numbers.

While oats continue to be the favorite crop of new Albertans, the low market price of that cereal during the last year has influenced many to sow fewer acres this year, putting in wheat instead. The acreage given to flax and barley shows


