taking has so evidently been with tokens of the Lord's farvor.

Br. John Doyle has been ordained from this Church.

Annapolis.—This church rejoices that they have been permitted to share in the invaluable blessings foretold, and promised to the church of God in those latter days. After a long season of trial, the Lord has been pleased to revive his work, and to bless the faithful labors of his servant and the prayers of his people; the attention of many have been called up to the concerns of religion, and the power of converting grace has been witnessed among the people. Thirty-eight have received the rite of baptism and joined the church. The brethren have requested the Association to be held with this church the ensuing year.

WILMOT.—Their letter states that the interests of religion are on the advance, and some have been brought to rejoice in its glorious influences. The cause of Temperance is prevailing, and drunkards and tipplers have been rescued from the jaws of ruin, and the wife and mother made to sing for joy.
