## LAWS AND REGULATIONS

## British and Foreign Bible Foriety.

I. The designation of the Society shall be, THE BRITISH AND FOREIGN BIRLE SOCIETY, of which the main object shall be to encourage a wider circulation of the Holy Scriptures without note or comment; the only copies in the Language of the Unit-ed Kingdom, to be circulated by the Society, shall be the Au-thorised Version.

II. This Society shall add its endeavors to those employed by other Societies, for circulating the Scriptures through the British Dominions: and shall, also according to its ability, extend its influence to other countries, whether Christian, Mahometan, or Pagan.

III. Each Subscriber of One Guinea annually shall be a

IV. Each Subscriber of ten Guineas at one time shall be a Member for life.

V. Each Subscriber of Five Guiness annually shall be a Governor.

VI. Each Subscriber of fifty pounds at one time, or who shall, by one additional payment, increase his original subscription to Fifty Pounds shall be a Governor for life.

VII. Governors shall be entitled to attend and vote at all Meetings of the Committee.

VIII. An Executor, paying a bequest of Fifty pounds shall e a Member for life; or, of One Hundred Pounds, a Governor

IX. A Committee shall be appointed to conduct the business of the Society, consisting of thirty-six Laymen, six of whom shall be Foreigners, resident in London or its vicinity; half the remainder shall be members of the Church of England and the other half members of other denominations of Christians. Twenty-seven of the above number, who shall have most frequently attended, shall be eligible for re-election for the ensu-

The Committee shall appoint all Officers, except the Trea surer, and call Special General Meetings, and shall be charge with procuring for the Society suitable patronage, both British

and Foreign.
