Summary of Evidence in the case of H-40722 Rfn Frederick GOODIE, "D" Coy., No 2 Bn., 1 Canadian Base Reinforcement Depot. Cdn Army (Overseas) ford.

The Commanding Officer directs that the evidence be taken on oath.

FIRST WITNESS FOR THE PROSECUTION Major John H LaCorm of Q.M. Corps. U.S. Army, having been duly sworn states:

"On wednesday night, 14 Jul 1943, at about 2130, while being driven south on Rue Georges Clemenceau, Phillipville, Algeria, a Canadian soldier, identified as Rhn F. Goodie, H-40722, tried to stop my vehicle. The driver, believing it to be another hitch-hiker started to go around him when he, Rfn Goodie, cursed at us. I ordered the driver to stop and went back to talk to the soldier, who again cursed at me. When told he was talking to a Major of the United States Army, hes reply was Me didn't "give a fuck" if the may, "The merican soldiers are all bastards", I then akked for his identity discs, and he let me have his number but not his name, being very disrespectful. Rather than cause a disturbance, I mounted the government vehicle and told the driver to go to the American Willtary Police Office. In starting out, Rfn Goodie struck at me, knocking my hat off. Upon arrival at the Military Police Office, I requested that Pte Erving Klotz, 32014920, call the British of Canadian Military Police, which was done. Pte Klotz then accompanied me to look for Rfn Goodie, who, when accosted, gave a different serial number and again refused to give his name, saying he did not have to give his name to any God-Danned American. At this time the British Patrol drove up and he, Goodie, agreed to walk up to the American Military Police Office. I again asked for his identity tags and again struck at me. Goodie was overpowered by an American Military Policeman and was taken away by the British and the Canadians. In my opinion the accused was quite sober and well aware of what he was doing.
