London, Nov. 4.—The Marquis of Lansdowne, Minister without portfolio announced in the House of Lords today that the government was firmly of the opinion that there should be no general election until after the war.

The suggestion was made in the House of Commons today by Sir Alfred Mond that legislation be enacted to suspend during the war, payment of rent, insurance premieums, interest on mortgages and similar fixed obligations of men who join the army. Sir Alfred whose suggestion was received with favor, said that these charges were like millstones around the necks of many men who, except for them, would be glad to enlist.

Premier Asquith said the government fully recognized the importance of the problem and promised to consider the suggestion carefully.


