(By Telegraph to Associated Press.)

LONDON, May 8.

Despatches from Madrid represent the Carlist movement fast losing its life; that the insurgents in Navarre, have all dispersed, and they are rapidly disappearing in the other provinces; and that Don Carlos is in France.

Reports by way of Paris, however, give to the insurrection an appearance of considerable vitality and designate the disposition and numbers of Carlist bands in various places.

Due De Broglie, French Ambassador at London, presented his letters of recall.

Basine surrendered on Tuesday to stand his trial by court-martial.

The Municipal Council of Paris has resolved to rebuild the Hotel de Ville at a cost of 7,500,000 francs.

Basine retired to his estate and will abstain from active participation in affairs for several months.

It is reported that the Pope declines to receive Prince Hohenzollern as German Ambassador.
