## Sub-Committee of Charity

TO THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

FOR THE YEAR 1881.

The Sub-Committee of Charity in laying before you their report for the past year, have pleasure in stating that the calls on them have been only \$244.22, as against. \$405.84 last year. The greater part of this difference is accounted for by their not having been called upon to forward applicants from the West to England and the East.

This year they had only one case to torward to England; this was a widow from River du Loup.

The number of cases relieved were 46—22 of which were residents of Quebec, some of whom/were sufferers by the fire of June last; they were supplied with money, flour, fuel and groceries.

Four were sent to the Finlay Asylum; an average of ten days each.

Eight were forwarded to Montreal and the West. Three, contributions to forward them to Manitoba. One sent to England.

Five transient relief.

One a loan of \$20.
