

on June 3, 1938, and joined the RCMP at that local as an investigator, grade 4, on June 14, 1972. He was promoted to level 6 on July 1, 1977, and posted to Clyde River Detachment shortly thereafter on August 9, 1977.

GATES 11000, ex-Cpl. Joseph Clarence Gates, 72, died at Saskatoon, Saskatchewan on May 8, 1979. Born in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, USA, on November 23, 1906, he joined the RCMP on August 27, 1931, at Regina. Upon completion of recruit training at Depot he was transferred to Winnipeg in November 1931, for a period of four months before being posted to "F" Division on March 1, 1932. In Saskatchewan he served at Regina, Moose Jaw, Prince Albert, Blain Lake, Shellbrook, Rosthern, Smeaton, and Tisdale Detachments up to 1946, when on September 1st he was transferred to "E" Division. There he served at Vernon and Williams Lake Detachments until his retirement on September 16, 1951. It was on April 1, 1943, that he was promoted to corporal.

HAYMAN 14579, ex-S/Sgt. Reginald Kenneth Hayman, 55, died October 23, 1979, at Hull, Quebec. He was born March 13, 1924, at New Glasgow, Nova Scotia, and joined the Force on June 3, 1943. After completing recruit training at Depot Division, Regina, and "N" Division, Ottawa, then an assignment with the Musical Ride, he was posted to Yorkton Detachment, Saskatchewan, on September 28, 1945. While in "F" Division he further served at Canora Detachment before being transferred to Charlottetown in 1948. In December 1950, he was transferred to "A" Division, Ottawa on general duties until March 1955, when he became division orderly. On February 1958, he was confirmed in rank having been promoted to acting corporal on May 1, 1957. In August 1958, he was transferred from division orderly to highway patrol supervisor, Ottawa, then to Protective

Sub-Division on June 4, 1962. He was promoted to sergeant May 1, 1964, and staff sergeant on May 1, 1968. He continued working in Protective Sub-Division at various positions until his retirement on June 2, 1972.

HICKMAN 13108, ex-Cpl. Edward Richard Hickman, 63, died at Ottawa on September 6, 1978. Born September 27, 1914, at Langstaff, Ontario, he joined the Force on December 20, 1938, at Vancouver, B.C., and was sent to Depot for recruit training. In January 1940, he was transferred to Rockcliffe, Ontario ("N" Division) then to "O" Division where he served at Cobourg, Toronto Town Station, Timmins, and Hamilton before being transferred to "D" Division in 1945 to serve at Winnipeg, Dauphin, and Winnipegosis Detachments. In December of 1950 he was transferred to Identification Branch, Ottawa, where he worked in Crime Index Section. While there he attained the rank of acting corporal on May 1, 1953, and was later confirmed in that rank one year later after his transfer to "D" Division Crime Index in January of 1954. In August 1955, he was posted to Kelowna Detachment, "E" Division, where he remained until his retirement from the Force on May 24, 1961. He had been awarded the Long Service Medal on November 27, 1958. After leaving the Force he and his family returned to Ottawa where he was employed with the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, Crime Division.

HIVEY 11414, ex-Cst. George Albert Hivey, 80, died in 1977, in Victoria, Australia. He was born March 6, 1897, in Lancashire, England, and served with the Royal Field Artillery of the British Expeditionary Force as a signaller, from March 22, 1915, until August 24, 1919. On September 17, 1927, having previously immigrated to Canada, he joined the Preventive Service, engaging in the RCMP on April 1, 1932, when the Preventive Service was absorbed. He
