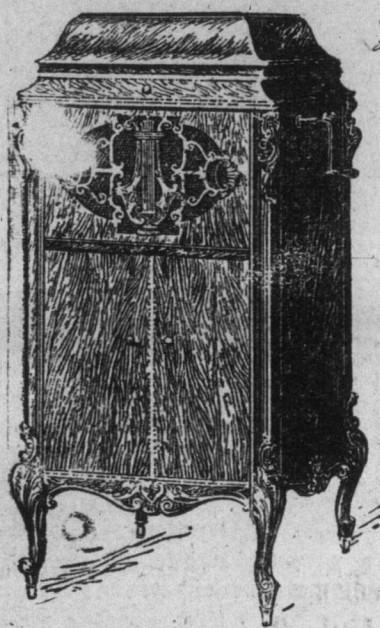

## DESMOND TURNS TO SERIOUS DRAMA

Star of Screen Comedy Appears in "The Mints of Hell," Spectacular and Melodramatic Picture of Yukon Gold Rush.

William Desmond, the popular big star who has been seen in the most delightful comedy-dramas recently, has in "The Mints of Hell," his latest Jesse D. Hampton production, the first serious drama he has done for Exhibitors Mutual release.

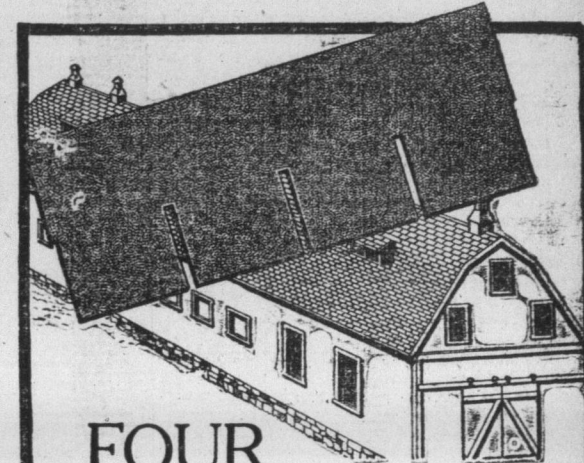
