

MAKING CHARACTER

What the Y.M.C.A. Stands for—The Predilections of its General Secretaries

Thomas Longboat ran at Boston as a member of the Toronto West Young Men's Christian Association. His sensational achievement in breaking the world's record for the distance naturally draws attention to the organization whose colors he bore to victory.
