III.—CONDUCT OF MEMBERS.

Not to vote if personally interested.

16. No Member is entitled to vote upon any question in which he has a direct pecuniary interest, and the vote of any Member so interested will be disallowed.—B. ~~302~~. M. 490. 453

Decorum in the House.

17. When the Speaker is putting a question, no Member shall walk out of or across the House, or make any noise or disturbance; and when a Member is speaking, no Member shall interrupt him, except to order, nor pass between him and the chair; and no Member may pass between the chair and the table, nor between the chair and the mace when the mace has been taken off the table by the Serjeant.—B. ~~343, 358~~. M. 385.

Attendance of Members.

18. Every Member is bound to attend the service of the House, unless leave of absence has been given him by the House.—B. ~~145, 136~~. M. 228, 233. 405; 406 421
