Wajesty's Sugar Colonies in the West Indies, a Cargo of Lumber of Provisions, Porfes of Weat Cattle, was erempt from Payment of the said Duty: Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Wajesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Tempozal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That, from and after the First Day of August One thousand seven hundred and eighty-eight, in all Tales where any Rum. or other Spirits, being the Produce or Manufacture of any of the said Colonies in the West Indies, shall be iefree, into that gally imported or brought into the said Province from Province, a ann of the said Malanian in any of the said Colonies, in any Ship or Aexel which. in her last preceding Clopage, Hall have carried to. and the Lumber, landed in, any of the faid Colonies, a Cargo of Lumber and Provisions. Heres or Weat Cattle, from the faid Province, it thall and may be lawful to admit to an Entry and land any Quantity of such Rum or Spirits. not exceeding in Ualue the Cargo of Lumber 82 Probisions, Hoises of Meat Cattle, so carried and landed, without Payment of the faid Duty of Sixpence per Gallon. That in all Cales where any Rum or other Suirits, being the Produce or Manufacture of any of the said Colonies in the West Indies, thall be legally imported or brought into the said Province from any of the said Tolonies, in any Ship of Cleffel which, in her nert clearing out from the faid Province after such Importation. thall load with a Cargo of Lumber of Provisions, Horses. Bondasherein of neat Cattle, in the faid Province, and hall carry to and land the same in some of the said Colonies, it thall and may be lawful to admit to an Entry and land any Quantity of such Rum of Spirits, not exceeding in Calue the Cargo of Lumber of Provisions, Poefes or Meat Cattle so loaded, without Payment of the said Duty of Sirpence per Gallon; provided always, that the Dwner of Dwners of such last mentioned Ship or Aestel, which hall so as aforciaid have legally imported fuch Rum of other Spirits, of in Cale of such Owner of Owners not reliding in the faid Province, the Hafter
