



Ottawa, May 22nd, 1929

Memorandum for the Prime Minister:

I attach McGill material amended in conformity with your later suggestions.

You will note that I have not attempted to deal with the subject of relations between Great Britain and the United States, as I know you have this very much in your own mind. I showed Dr. Skelton the letter from Dr. McKay, who agrees that McGill Convocation would afford a seasonable time and place for a word regarding the importance of preserving relations between the two countries. He feels that one ought not to emphasize any danger of a tension in these relations. A tension is sometimes produced by discussion of an alleged danger. Doubtless, however, you have considered this aspect of the matter.
