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ment in the paper, mentioned that there was a proportionate reduction on raw materials used in the manufacture of these machines, but in pursuing the full text of the Budget resolutions, we cannot see any allowance whatever, or any reduction on the duty of raw materials for this purpose.

We certainly do not think that the Government has given any consideration whatever, as to how this reduction will effect Manufacturers of Dairy Machinery in Canada, and we really think that this reduction is only a concession to the Progressives in the West to enable them to re-establish themselves with the Creamery men in the West, and to help them to off-set the bad impression they made on the Creamery industry when they took the stand they did on the Australian Treaty.

As you know the Creameries protested very strongly against the butter from Australia being allowed to come in at such a low duty under the Australian Treaty, and we really think that this is only a concession to aid the Progressives to regain the favour they lost.

Any action you may take to fight against this very unfair reduction, will certainly be appreciated by us.
