Dear Mr. Meighen,-

I am enclosing a copy of a letter from Mr. Elmer C. Thompson, Georgetown, Ontario, in opposition to Bill F of the Senate, amendment to the Insurance Act of 1932. This letter will speak for itself.

I may say that, personally, I cannot see any valid reason for permitting Lloyd's to register in Canada without maintaining a deposit similar to that exacted from other insurance corporations. I understand that Lloyd's are not a company but are private individuals associated for mutual benefit under an association doing business as insurance agents. I would like to know in what way this entitles them to avoid making a deposit similar to other companies.
