In the name of His Majesty The King I thank you for the energetic and decisive manner in which you have responded to the demands of this critical time. You have given prompt consideration to the measures necessary for the defence of our country. You have freely decided that Canada should co-operate with Great Britain and France in the war which is now being waged to resist aggression, and have enacted measures which will enable this country to make an effective contribution to this great purpose.
