Me Stewart, the Agent in this lity of hadam Farijana, called in respect to this mather, and stated that, as madam Farijana had paid in full for all trees of nine inches at the butt and over, and as there was no question of dues involved in pegard to the stuff manufactured by her from the trees, she claimed that she had a right to do what she pleased with the timber, and that she found it more profitable to cut it up into cordwood; and as madam Farijana states that timber which
