
Ottawa, February 4, 1914.

Sir:-

The outstanding balance of the second and third instalments of purchase money on the S.E.1/4, Sec. 11, Tp. 30, Rge. 23, W-4-M, is very much required by the Department to be expended for the original owners of the land, the Indians, and as the conditions of the surrender cannot be carried out without the purchasers complying with the conditions of the sale, and forwarding the instalments due, which in your case amounts to \$678.00, composed of \$512.00 principal and \$176.00 interest, being computed to the 14th instant, it is expected that you will issue a cheque for the above total on receipt of this letter, so that it will reach the Department about the date stated.

Unless you comply with this request, it will be necessary to consider the question of cancellation of the sale, forfeiture of money paid and redispotion of the land.
