Unnumbered message. Most Secret and Personal. Following for your Prime Minister, Begins:

- 1. You will have noticed that no details harebeen included in daily Circular D.W. telegrams as to the presence of United Kingdom treeps in France. Explanation is as follows.
- 2. Such mention of British troops in France as has appeared in the press was due to the publication in Peris of sertain information on the subject owing to failure to exercise adequate conscribing in France. Since secreey had been lost to this extent, press here were allowed to make a similar statement.
- being strictly limited to those who are actually engaged in dealing with the movements in question and these whose duties actually require them to have such knowledge. The reason for this is that any disclosures, even of most general character, might afford information to the enemy which would gravely imperil our forces. In 1914 the German Government were unaware of the presence of British treeps until they found them engaged in action. In view of the greater risk of air attack the need for secrecy is still stronger today.
