CRYSTAL READING—MAY 22, 1932*

At 1.40 P.M. Mr. Carrington hands crystal to Mrs. G. Mrs. Warner moves nearer the medium, acting as sitter. Medium asks her to hold the crystal for a moment. Mrs. Warner does so, and returns the crystal to medium. During the crystal reading Mr. Carrington whispers a series of stimulus words into the medium's ear, calculated to arouse emotional reactions in Uvani. Although these words were doubtless heard by Mrs. G's subconscious mind, no appreciable galvanic deflections were noted, during the sitting.

Mrs. G. (*Conscious State*): I first get the impression of a lost brooch. (1) I get the impression of a lady kneeling down before a chest of drawers. . . . (2) . . . You have a sort of little electric something in your house. (3) I have the impression that you are looking at recipes, trying-out something. . . . You seem to be looking in the evening at a number of photographs, and saying "that reminds me of something." . . . I see you with somebody, Laurie or Laura. . . . I get round a bend in the lane toward the water, and a big, shaggy dog . . . You are very fond of printed chiffons, I get the blue and lavender. You have one frock of cream-colored leaves that you are very fond of, and one with a striking green pattern. (4) I have a feeling that you will discharge someone, a colored woman, I see her going out. . . . She is talking about an accident. (5) . . . You are fond of gardens. One especial part of the garden is very dear to you. I also want to say that you have something like gladiolas, or iris, very fine, and I get a little patch of lilies, because they have a special feeling for you. (6) I see you going to something like a tennis tournament. (7) You are going to get a Stella. She comes from the South. . . . I don't see anything more for you. . . .

- (4) This is much better than appears. What Mrs. G. said was:
"I see you surrounded with chiffons, printed chiffons. You have one dress blue, bright blue, one with a striking green figure on it, and one covered with little cream leaves or roses, and a grey one." This is correct, and only one has been worn outside my own apartment.
- (5) This is peculiar, as I had a clairvoyant vision that checked with a negress in Africa, and I requested none of them to come again!
