Tonight I propose briefly to discuss both. The final test of all policies and actions is whether they serve the interests of the people better than some other course. Government is not conducted to serve the political interests of the opponents of an administration or the personal interests of the people's representatives in Parliament. The interests of the people themselves are the supreme concern of democratic government. You, the people, would do well to remember that you, at all times, are the sovereign power in the State. Your representatives in Parliament do not constitute the power of democracy. Neither the government or even Parliament is sovereign. Your representatives, your government and your Parliament are your servants; all alike are finally responsible to you, their masters. Once you allow yourselves to be blind to this view, once you begin to think of your representatives as possessing rights superior to those which you yourself enjoy, once you think of the government as supreme over

Parliament, or of Parliament
