Cross-examined by the Prosecutor:

Sergeant, before this incident in the Canteen, do you know if any official notice of the parade had been published?

- 4 -

- A Yes. Sir.
- Q Had you seen it?
- A Yes.Sir.
- Q I show you Exhibit "F". Is the parade mentioned in paragraph 3 the parade you refer to?
- A That is the one, Sir.
- Q I notice the time of the parade is mentioned as at 1310 hours. You say today that you ordered the accused to report at 1315?
- A Yes, Sir. They were to form up at 3.10 and be on parade at 3.15.
- This parade was not for 3.10 or 3.15; it is 1310 hours. Well, now what time was the accused to be on parade?
- A I said it was 1315. Sir.
- Q Do you know if he did appear on that parade?
- A Yes. Sir.
- id you see him there?
- A Yes, Sir. I called the roll, Sir.
- Q Did he answer his name?
- A Yes. Sir.

The Defending Officer declines to re-examine this Witness.

The Witness withdraws.

- Will you give the Court your number, your name, rank and Unit?
- A H-82179 Private Hayhurst, T.E., Brandon Military Hospital, R.C.A.M.C.
- What were your duties, Frivate Hayhurst, on the 14th, 15th, 16th and 17th of May, 1945?
- A I was working in the Mens' Canteen, Sir.
- 0. As what?
- A As Steward, or their Barman.
- You were warned for a parade on the 16th day of May, 1945?
- A That is right, Sir.
- 0 By whom?
- A By Sergeant Flynn, Sir.
- Will you tell the Court the phrases used, or the way in thich this N.C.O., Sergeant Flynn, gave you the order?
