

JUDGE ADVOCATE:

I think the proper way is to deal with each case as it arises. I am not sure what particular evidence you refer to. We will have to consider them as we come to them.

PROSECUTOR:

Is it the desire of the Court that the documents taken from the Town Major's office may be submitted for identification now, subject to further identification later by the Town Major.

JUDGE ADVOCATE:

I would say merely for identification at this time and not as part of the record.

PROSECUTOR:

Very good, sir, we will give them a number by which they can be referred to and the Town Major will in due course be called.

JUDGE ADVOCATE: (To Mr. Gage)

Is that satisfactory to you?

MR. GAGE:

Yes. I won't object to that. Of course, this is only for the Town Major's documents?

PROSECUTOR:

Yes. That is what I am speaking of at the moment.

PROSECUTOR (Resuming examination-in-chief.)

Q.14 The first one which I now show you, which is described as "Serial ACCH/300, 58 Oranje Nassaulaan" and signed by J.H. Byerley, Major R.A., Town Major; -- is this one of the documents?

A.14 Yes. That is one of the documents.

PROSECUTOR:

It might be convenient if we just leave that particular number on it.

MR. GAGE:

Yes. Refer to it as Exhibit "L".

(Document marked "Serial ACCH/300, 58 Oranje Nassaulaan" and signed by Major J.H. Byerley, is marked "L" for identification.)
