

through personal observation of foreign children in the community, or through stories, pictures, objects, nursery rhymes, folklore, games, etc., the other children of the world may be brought into his life.

For Boys and Girls Nine to Twelve Years of Age

The interest in stories continues, but the stories are of a different character. Adult experiences and heroic acts of the physical sort interest boys and girls of this age, and the tales must be true and must concern big and wonderful deeds in order to excite the hero-worshipping junior. It is the memory period, when the great names, places, events, etc., may be eagerly learned as foundation knowledge for future study and activity.

The organization of the junior classes or department into a week-day mission band, study classes and societies is now possible and should be emphasized. The following missionary activities have been reported as being successful: impersonations in exercises and plays, the salute of the Christian flag, illustration of a missionary hymn in a notebook, map-tracing, the collection of foreign postage stamps, post cards and coins.
