

meat, pork, salt and dried meat, turkeys, geese, ducks, poultry, game, butter, eggs, fruit, vegetables and all kinds of live stock and produce usually brought to and sold in Public markets.

WOOD, HAY AND STRAW MARKET.

II. That gore or wedge of land on the Bannatyne Estate, at the junction of Albert and Annie streets, presented to the City of Winnipeg by A. G. B. Bannatyne, Esq., M.P., shall be and is hereby declared to be the public Hay, Straw and Wood Market, for the sale thereon, respectively, of all kinds of hay, straw and firewood brought to this City for sale, and shall be designated as Hay Market No. 1.

III. The limits of the Central Market shall be as follows, namely: The western end of the ground floor of the new market buildings, and all the market grounds west of the main or outside entrances to the said western portion of the ground floor of said buildings.

IV. The limits of the Hay, Straw and Wood Market shall be the gore or wedge of land hereinbefore described, and the streets on each side thereof, to wit: Albert and Annie streets, provided always, that any part of the Hay, Straw and Wood Market which may be in or upon any of the streets aforesaid shall at all times be subsidiary to the use of the same as streets or thoroughfares, and so as not wholly or seriously to obstruct the travel thereon.

V. The Chief of Police, and under him the lessee of any public market, shall be the Superintendent of the Markets, and shall, under the control and direction of the Market Committee appointed by the Council, have the care and superintendence of the said markets, market places and weigh houses; and it shall be his duty to execute and carry into effect all regulations, orders and by-laws for the government of said markets, and to prosecute any breach thereof, and to keep a record of the same. The said superintendent and also his deputies or assistants, if any, shall be sworn in as special constables, and shall wear a badge indicative of his or their authority as such.

VI. It shall be the duty of the Superintendent of the Markets, when necessary, or when directed by the Market Committee, to appoint proper persons to perform menial duties and services in and about the said markets and market places, whom he may remove at pleasure, and to whom such remuneration and pay shall be given as the Market Committee may from time to time determine; and the said Superintendent shall be held responsible for the good conduct and behavior of such persons while so employed. Negligence, incapacity, partiality or the slightest breach of trust in the performance of his or their duties shall subject the said Superintendent or assistant to immediate suspension by the Market Committee, who shall at once report the case to the Council for their decision.

VII. It shall not be lawful for the Superintendent, or any of his assistants, to trade, either directly or indirectly, in, or have any direct or indirect interest in the sales or profits of any things or animals which shall be brought or exposed for sale on any of the said Markets or Market places, or to purchase any such on behalf of any other person or persons; but the said

Superintendent or his assistants shall not hereby be prohibited from purchasing in the said Markets what may be necessary for the private use of themselves and families.

VIII. It shall be the duty of said Superintendent to cause all Markets to be kept open daily, except Sundays, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Dominion Day, and any day set apart as Thanksgiving Day, from five o'clock in the morning, until four o'clock in the afternoon, from the first day of May until the first day of November, and from six o'clock in the morning until four o'clock in the afternoon, from the first day of November until the first day of May, in each and every year; Provided always, That on the Saturday in each and every week and on the days preceding any Holidays named in this clause the said Markets shall be kept open until ten o'clock at night, unless the Saturday falls on Christmas, New Year's, Dominion or Thanksgiving Day, in which case the said Markets shall be kept open until the same hour the preceding Friday night. The said Superintendent, or his assistants, shall attend the said Markets constantly during market hours.

IX. It shall be the duty of the said Superintendent to cause all dirt or filth in or about the said Markets to be removed with all possible celerity; to inspect all articles brought to the Markets; to decide all differences and disputes thereon between buyers and sellers; to classify all denominations of vendors in the said Markets; and to arrange all those contiguously, who deal in the same or similar articles; to arrange all vehicles brought to the said Markets; and to enforce with impartiality all regulations for the government of the same.

X. The said Superintendent shall be *ex officio* Weigh Master for the City of Winnipeg, and it shall be in addition to his duties as said Superintendent, to keep open the Markets, Weigh House or Weigh Houses, as soon as the same are established, and to attend thereat during Market hours for the purpose of weighing articles required to be weighed, and the scales, weights, and measures, and everything connected with them, shall be maintained in a clean and orderly manner; and he shall weigh and measure the different articles that are sold, or are to be sold, and disposed of in the said Markets, whenever required by the parties interested therein, or any one of them, for which weighing and measuring, he shall be entitled to ask, demand, and receive the charges set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

XI. It shall be the duty of said Weigh Master when any article or articles are brought to be weighed or measured, loaded on a waggon or other vehicle.

(1.) To furnish the owner or person having charge of the load, with a weigh note, dated, and signed by him, the said Weigh Master, setting forth the gross weight of such load, with the waggon or other vehicle, and the tare of the waggon or other vehicle, the net weight of the load, and name of the seller;

(2.) Whenever required to do so, either by the purchaser or seller, on the same day that he has weighed any load, and after the load has been unloaded, to weigh the waggon or other

vehicle, upon which to endorse upon each of such waggons.

XII. There shall be no weighing in the Central Market, and there shall be no such other weighing of such other Weighing machines, at such said City as may be by By-Law.

XIII. The purchaser of fresh meat, dairy produce, or any other weight or measure shall be weighed by the Master, or any of his assistants, or any such hay, straw, farm or garden produce or thing so sold, refuses such demand, "weigh note" required, when the same shall be deemed to be by By-Law.

XIV. That all loads weighed by his assistants, shall be weighed by his assistants, upon buying or selling.
