

forgiveness of sins, and that by Him all that believe are justified? (Acts xiii. 38, 39). And that we are justified by His blood? (Rom. v. 9.) All those who truly believe in Jesus can say: "To Him who loves us, and has washed us in His blood."

The Spirit of God caused the truth to shine suddenly in his heart, his face became radiant with joy, and he cried:

"Blessed be God! blessed be God! * * * I see, I see, * * * I am white as snow before Him by faith in the blood of the Lamb."

Thus delivered from the bondage of the law by the blood of Christ, he also became a witness of the grace of God toward lost sinners. Thus the consequences of that memorable snow storm spread more and more, at the same time as the precious history of "sins like crimson" made "white as snow" by faith in the "blood of the Lamb."

DEEP as is man's ruin, the love of God is deeper still. Black as is his guilt the blood of Jesus can wash it all away. Wide as is the chasm separating man from God, the cross has bridged it. God has come down to the very lowest point of the sinner's condition, in order that He might lift him up into a position of infinite favor, in eternal association with His Son.
