INDIGESTION IN CALVES. I have three calves that do not eat weil. They chew sticks, and grind their teeth, and get weaker until they cannot

Ans.—Give each four ounces raw linseed oil, and follow up with one of the following powders, three times daily, in a pint of new milk. Take two ounces each of gentian, ginger and nux vomica and bicarbonate of soda. Mix, and make into forty-eight powders. Give them new milk, with one-quarter of its bulk of lime water to drink, and feed on firstclass clover hay, a little chopped oats with the hulls sifted out, and a few pulped roots. Feed in small quantities, and often.

LAME IN FOOT.

I have a horse lame in fore foot. Pressure in the hollow of the heel causes pain. He is quite lame when he starts, but improves on being driven a mile or so, and then gets worse again. C. A. G.

Ans.-I am afraid your horse has navicular disease, and, if so, will not be of much further use for road purposes. You will have to give him rest; remove the shoes, and give him a nice box stall. Make a blister of two drams each of biniodide of mercury and cantharides, mixed, with two ounces vaseline. Clip the hair off for two inches high all around the hoof. Tie so that he cannot bite the parts. Rub well with the blister once daily for two days, and on the third day wash off and apply sweet Let him loose in the box stall now, and oil every day. As soon as the scale comes off, tie him up and blister again, and, after this, blister once every four weeks until spring. If an alteration in structure has not taken place, this will effect a cure, and, at all events, will cause an improvement.

LAME MARE.

Mare, fourteen years old, went lame three months ago. She goes sound after a rest; but, after being driven a mile or two, she goes lame. There is a hard lump on inside of leg, just below the knee.

Ans.-It is seldom an aged horse goes lame from splint; but this one, doubtless, involves the knee joint, and it will be very hard to treat. Make a blister of two drams each of biniodide of mercury and cantharides, mixed with two ounces vaseline. Clip the hair off lump and inner surface of lower part of knee. Tie so that she cannot bite the part. Rub well with the blister once daily for two days. On the third day, wash off and apply sweet oil. Let her loose in a box stall now, and oil every day. When the scale comes off, tie her up and blisten again. Of course, give rest. If this treatment does not effect a cure, get your veterinarian to fire the part. It is possible the lameness is in the foot, and it would probably be wise to get your veterinarian to examine her before you

CHOKING.

Cow appeared to choke, and bloated badly. I put my hand down her throat, but could feel nothing. She coughed and vomited, and then got all right. She has done this twice. She is fed on pulped roots, corn and straw. J. A. B.

Ans.—She undoubtedly choked. You cannot get your hand far enough down the throat to feel the obstruction, except, in rare cases, where it is very high up. She feeds too greedily, and endeavors to swallow large boluses, partially moistened and masticated, and they lodge in the gullet. Then symptoms of choking are shown, and bloating takes place. She has, so far, succeeded in coughing the obstruction up when bloating and other symptoms suddenly disappear; but she may not always be so fortunate. I would suggest feeding her from a manger with large surface, and scattering the food thinly, so that she cannot get a large mouthful. Each time she chokes has a tendency to chronically dilate a portion of the gullet, and when this is the case, an animal cannot eat with impunity anything except sloppy
