M1. Jessen, prayed leave to bring in a Bill for the further regulating and preventing of Disorder at Elections, leave given accordingly.

The House then resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House on the Impost Bill.

Mr. Pyke, Chairman of the Committee reported a Draft of a Bill, intitled An At to Revive, alter and continue the several Laws relating to the Duties of Impost on Beer, Rum, and other distilled Spirituous Liquors, which Laws expired the Thirty First Day of December, 1784.

And thereupon moved, That the faid Bill be engrossed, and read a third Time on Monday, ordered accordingly.
