Mr. Chipman, by leave, presented a Petition of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the City and County of Saint John, praying for Legislative aid and assistance to reimburse them for extraordinary expenses incurred in support of transient Poor in the said City.

Which being read, ordered that the same be received and referred to the Committee of Supply.

Mr. Stubs, by leave, presented a Petition of sundry Farmers, Mill Proprietors, and Lumber Dealers, in the County of Charlotte, praying that protecting duties may be laid on Foreign Lumber, Bread Stuffs and Provisions, imported irto this Province.

Which being read, ordered that the same be received and lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Chipman, resolved that the House do now go into Committee of the whole House on the bill, " to authorize the Justices of the Peace for the City " and County of Saint John, to levy a further assessment on the inhabitants of the " said City, for the purpose of building and finishing a Poor-House in the said " City,"

Mr. Speaker left the Chair.

Mr. Fraser took the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

Mr. Fraser, from the Committee, reported that they had gone thro' the bill, and had agreed to the same without any amendment.

Ordered that the bill be engrossed.

Mr. Simonds moved for leave to bring in a bill, "to amend the Laws now in force "relating to trespasses, and to make further regulations to prevent the same." Leave granted.
