Ontario Power Ready.

Not only does the Ontario hydro-elecric scheme promise to be a great boon to the municipalities of western Ontario by furnishing them with power at half the former cost, but there is already evidence that the working out of the scheme will prove a triumph of engineering skill in the way of long distance transmission of electric power. Last Saturday evening a test was made of the ine from Niagara Falls to Berlin via Dundas, a distance of 115 miles. The test was exceedingly successful and the power was stepped up to 180,000 volts, which was carried without a hitch. This is regarded as a triumph of engineering. From an engineering point of view it is said that this performance has never been equalled. Everything has been done on a scale so far in advance of previously existing conditions that there were no standards or patterns from which the transformers and other apparatus could be made, so that special patterns had to be designed.

Postmaster's Grievances.

Resolutions requesting that postmasters be given increased pay for their extra duties in connection with rural mail delivery, that they be placed on the civil servant's list, and that postmasters who have grown old in the service granted pensions, were passed by the Dominion Postmasters at their convention in Toronto last week. It was urged that postmasters under the United States service were receiving salaries fifty to one hundred per cent larger than Canadian postmasters. "We are cursed with cheap politics and ignorance," said one speaker expressively, during the discussions, though he added that conditions were gradually becoming better.
