Judgment for Plaintiff

The only case to be aired before Judge Greig at the Division Court here on Fri. day was an action brought by Jos. Doyle of near Chepstow against Robt. Bell, a Culross farmer, for \$15.00 damages for the non-delivey of a pair of ewe lambs. Doyle claims to have bargained with Bell for the lambs at \$12 each, while Bell maintains that he was to pay him the highest market price when he should call for them. On coming for them, Doyle, however, only brought \$24.00 with him but as Bell wanted \$27.00, a little heckling took place, with the result it seems that Doyle agreed to pay him the extra \$3.00 later, but as the latter apparently didn't care to trust Doyle for this amount, he refused to pass him the ewes unless he planked down the \$27. The upshot was that Doyle sucd Bell for \$15.00 damages for non-delivery of the lambs, and was given judgment against him for \$10.00, together with court costs of \$4.65.
