OCCURRED EARLY SUNDAY

Dwyer Seems to Have Had Two or Three Scraps-James Manson Is quest Has Proved Nothing.

Last Saturday evening John Dwyer, the Red Eagle mine, quarreled and was investigating the affair, learned that Dwyer was in a dying condition and caused his removal to the Sister's hospital, where every effort was made to save the unfortunate man's life. At 6 o'clock in the morning Dwyer died.

In the meantime Constable Forrester was searching the city for the assailant, who, upon hearing of Dwyer's critical condition, gave himself up and was lodged in jail. Little was known of the serious turn of affairs until morning when the story of Dwyer's death was generally circulated. Then accounts of the trouble were revived.
