### Electric Heating for Buildings

Electric heating of rooms, on the hot-water system, is now carried on in Stockholm. In the top story of a building is a heat-insulated water tank with electric heating devices...  
In certain districts a homestead in good standing may be exempt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$250 per acre.

## REGISTRATION FOR PROVINCE TO BE ASKED

### Deputation Will Wait Shortly on Premier Hearst.

By Special Wire to the Courier.  
Toronto, March 16.—A deputation of leading citizens of the Province of Ontario will shortly wait on Premier Hearst and ask that an act be passed providing for a complete registration of all persons in the province, male and female, between the ages of 15 and 55, excepting those enrolled in the expeditionary forces.  
The object of the registration is to find out the resources of the province in men fit for military and other service and its entire resources in workers.  
There is another end in view, and that is that this province may not be drained of its workers after it has completed its quota of the 500,000 men Canada is contributing for war service abroad. Ontario's share yet to be raised of this total is \$7,000,000.  
The act which the deputation will ask to have submitted provides that the provincial secretary shall be the central registration authority, and the councils of all cities, towns, townships and villages shall be local registration authorities for the respective areas or returns are to be compiled and such information as the central registration authority requires furnished to the central office.

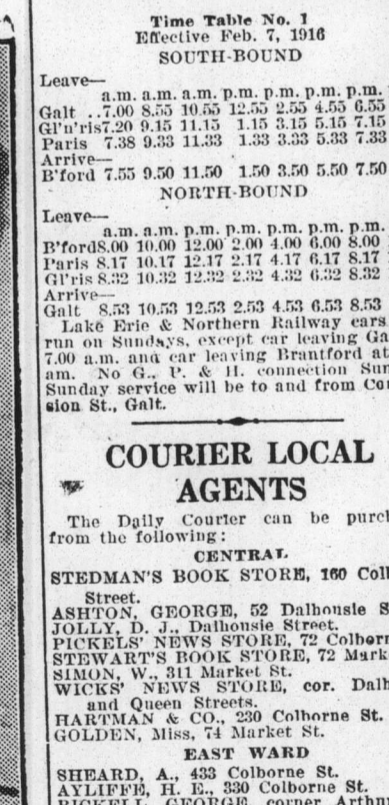
