London, June I—Lieutenant Sir
Ernest Shackelton, the Antarctic explorer, has arrived safely at Port
Stanley, Falkland Islands.

The news that Lieut. Shackelton was safe reached London shortly after midnight, The message was from the explorer himself, and announced his arrival at Port Stanley.

The message said his ship, the Endurance, had been "crushed" in a Weddel Sea ice floe last October, but that it drifted until Midwinter, when he and his party landed on Elephant Island in the South Shetland group.
