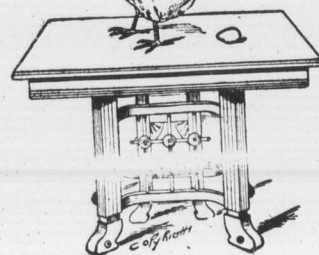

## COURT OF REVISION

Take notice that

1. The Council of the Corporation of the Village of Athens has constructed as a local improvement granolithic sidewalks

On the West side of Elgin Street, from Prince Street to Wellington Street.

On the North side of Wiltse Street, from Elgin Street to the Western limit of M. L. Wilson's property.

On the East side of Elgin Street, from Prince Street to Northern limit of Miss L. Wiltse's property.

On the North side of Wellington Street, from Elma Street to Sarah Street.

On the West side of Elgin Street, from the Northern limit of A. E. Donovan's property to connect with the town hall walk.

On the North side of Church Street, from Mill Street to Victoria Street.

On the West side of Victoria Street, from Main Street to Central Street.

On the South side of Central Street, from Victoria to Elgin Street.

2. The cost of the work is \$3532.13, of which \$1948.35 is to be paid by the Corporation. The special rate per foot frontage is 6 cents. The special assessment is to be paid in 20 annual installments.

3. The estimated lifetime of the work is 25 years.

4. The schedules for this special assessment are on file in the Clerk's Office, where they may be inspected.

5. A Court of Revision will be held on the 17th day of July 1913, at 7.30 o'clock at the Town Hall for the purpose of hearing complaints against the proposed assessments or the accuracy of frontage measurements and any other complaint which persons interested may desire to make and which is by law cognizable by the Court.

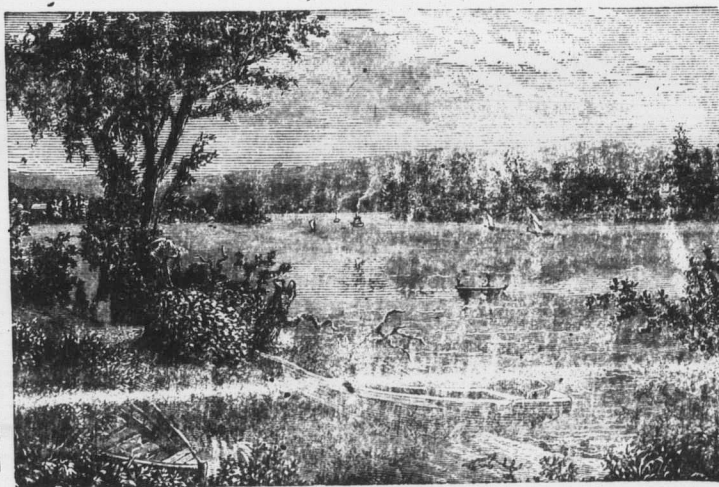
