Thought a Saloon Keeper was After Him

And He Challenged the Hotel Mau to Meet him in the Ring-The Encounter a Draw.

Royal Oak, Mich., Dec. 13 .- About the sole topic of conversation in this village is the encounter on Saturday night between Rev. J. J. Axtell, pas-tor of the Congregational church, and Gus Dondero, a saloonkeeper. At 10 o'clock at night they met in R. J. Kenny's barn, all fixed up for the occasion being well lighted and a ring laid out All the sports of the town were pres-ent and when Gus Dondero, proprie-tor of the Royal Oak House, the mar who had been aimed at in the crusade of the churches against saloonists, enof the churches against sationists, entered the ring, he was made the favorite in the betting. His second was Albert Hupert, another saloonkeeper. Mr. Kenny was in the preacher's corner. Herman Bartello was the time-keeper. Before the contest started betting was 5 to 1 on the saloonkeeper.

The contestants put up a rattling good fight the first round, when Deputy Sheriff Lewless stepped in and tried to prevent the fight, but at Rev Mr. Axtell's earnest solicitation he did not interfere. Dondero, who is thirty five pounds heavier than the preach er, started right in, but he had me his match. The minister landed one of the jaw which almost floored Dondero, the latter got back with a strong punch on the preacher's nose. After five rounds of lively fighting the referee, William McCavey, called it a draw, much to the disgust of the ho tel man's party, who claimed that their man had much the best of it, and that e should have been given the decis-

There was considerable talk about he affair on Sunday, but Rev. Mr. Axtell preached his usual sermons a though nothing had happened, and i not at all concerned over his way of settling his difference with Dondero Monday morning the reverend gen man was seen at his home and in givman was seen at his home and in giv-ing an account of the affair said that for many years he had tried nearly every system of reform that he knew of, that the saloon element was the most difficult to deal with, but that he had always regarded himself as be-ng able to cope with it. He stated hat the reason for the position he ook in this matter was that a man to whom he had given money to buy food with had spent it at the saloons and that he had gone into the place for the sake of seeing with his own eyes if the story was true. The min-ister says that he was told that there was a movement on foot to drive him out of town if he did not prove his ability as a boxer, so rather than show the white feather he consented to meet Dondero in a respectable way. Then, to quote Rev. Mr. Axtell: "The result of it was that I finally went with hem and gave them satisfaction. hink I am the better man with the gloves. I am satisfied with the showgloves. I am satisfied with the showing I made Sunday night, handicapped as I was in the matter of weight."

Mr. Dondero, in his version of the affair, says it was not brought about by saloonkeepers, but by a warm friend of Mr. Axtell.
