BATHING AT HOME.

A Medical Recipe For Obtaining the Best Results.

The finest method of bathing at home by which one can attain the best results in keeping the body in a clean, healthful condition, can be taken in the following manner: First, it is necessary to facilitate the thorough cleansing of the thousands of small pores in the body to open those pores by means of heat (sweating). If one has the advantage of one of the small cabinet bathtubs that are on the market it will supply the best means of producing perspiration; otherwise lying in a tub of warm water and gradually getting it as hot as can be borne and lying in that for a period of from five to ten minutes will produce the same result. Have a five pound bag of ordinary table salt, and, after placing the salt in a pitcher of suitable size, moisten the salt with hot water, enough to wet it through. Stand in tub and give the body a thorough rubbing with the salt.

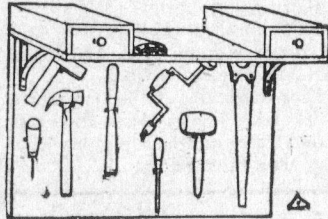
This operation should take not less than twenty minutes to rub the entire body. The salt removes the dead cuticle that is being constantly pushed off from the body by the new cuticle forming and which cannot be removed by soap. It also produces an active circulation of blood throughout the entire body. The salt is also a fine thing for the scalp and should be rubbed into the hair and scalp at least once a week. After giving the body a thorough rubbing it is necessary to cool off properly, thereby closing the pores and eliminating all possibility of taking cold after the bath. Lie in the tub and turn the cold water on gradually, and let the water in the tub get as cold as possible, then dry off with a rough towel.

If this method of bathing is practiced once or twice a week it will keep the body in a thoroughly clean and healthful condition.—Medical Talk For the Home.

THE HOUSE TOOLS.

A Way to Have Them Always Handy in the Kitchen.

"My husband," says a correspondent of Good Housekeeping, "has found a convenient disposal of tools in common use to be a board about 1 1/2 by 2 feet, with a shelf above and a small drawer at each end of the shelf. Nails driven into the board hold the tools,

and a surprising number may be fitted into place upon it. I made a cotton flannel case for his bits, much like a knife and spoon case. This is placed upon the shelf, while nails and screws fill the drawers. The whole is screwed into a convenient space upon the kitchen wall. When needed each tool is at hand and is easily replaced."

HUSTLING FISHERY OVERSEER.

Makes Three Fish Seizures and Confiscates Many Cases.

Niagara Falls, Ont., May 7.—Provincial Fish Overseer Shelley on Saturday morning seized seven boxes of fish at the Michigan Central Station, here that were passing through the Niagara Fish Co. at Buffalo. The cases contained pickerel (dore), with white fish and mullet from H. Koehler, Dutton, Ont. The pickerel were sent to the poor house at Welland, and the other fish that were not subject to the fish regulations were sold.

Saturday evening Officer Shelley at Bridgeburg, at 8.40 p. m., boarded the O. T. R. express car and found eight boxes containing several bass and pickerel, with other fish, four boxes being for the Niagara Fish Co., Buffalo, from A. Hoover, Dunnville; three boxes for Whinn & Co., New York City, from W. W. Casey, Wainfleet, Ont.; and one box for A. Booth & Co., Buffalo, from H. W. Almsley, Port Dover, Ont. These were re-addressed and sent to Niagara Falls and placed in cold storage.

The officer covered the Michigan Central train at 6.30 Sunday morning and ran into another haul of forbidden fish, 33 boxes in all, of mixed fish, many of them subject to the fish regulations. The whole lot was consigned to the Niagara Fish Co., Buffalo, being 13 boxes from Bert Clay, Iona, Ont.; 2 boxes from Johnson and Parish, Dutton; 12 boxes from S. F. Randall, Rodney, Ont., and 1 box from P. Campbell, Ridgeway, Ont. Each box contained more or less pickerel. Those subject to fish regulation will be given to deserving persons, and the others sold.

Protecting the Fish. Brookville, May 7.—There is much illegal fishing along the St. Lawrence River at present, and Overseer J. Fraser is getting after the lawbreakers with an iron hand. He has recently captured hundreds of feet of gill nets, night lines, dynamite and other devices for destroying game fish. He is on the track of the offenders.
