"THE FATAL FLOWER."

We are always more or less interested in stage stories which are constructed on lines bearing close relation to human nature as we know it, and we are anxious to see how characters of a play bear themselves through whatever varieties of fortune the dramatist has seen fit to direct their paths, and to study their relations to our own experiences. A play which deals exclusively with realism and natural characters that

are drawn true to life, certainly seems to interest us and hold our attention longer than those prompted by idealism. The new play "The Fatal Flower," the latest of stage offerings by Howard Hall, which will be presented for the first time in this city to-morrow night, at the Brisco Opera House, is a conspicuous example of that type of drama which closely adheres to the atmosphere of naturalness. The scenes of the play are laid in Washington, D. C., and all its characters are delightfully drawn. The play serves as a vehicle for the starring tour of William Walcott, and the leading role is said to be peculiarly adapted to his temperament. Mr. Walcott will be supported by Florence Rossland, who assumes the part of Marion de Yondo, and a specially selected cast of well-known players. The scenic efforts are elaborate, and the dressing rich in the extreme.

"THE WALLS OF JERICHO" - ON THURSDAY, JAN. END.

Alfred Sutro, author of "The Walls of Jericho," is one of the most interesting figures in the dramatic field in England to-day. His rise has been made in the last three years. He is the son of a country doctor, and was educated from the London schools, and in Brussels. His father intended him for commercial life, and he developed an exceptional faculty for business. His best, however, was for literary work, and when he had assured himself of a steady income, he abandoned trade and devoted himself to literature. He wrote a number

of plays during the seven years before "The Walls of Jericho" was produced. It was first presented at the Garrick Theatre, London. It was then brought to this country and given at the Savoy Theatre, New York. It has also been produced in Holland at the Hague Theatre. It has twice been played by Imperial companies before the Emperor of Germany, the performance being given by an English company.

Mr. Sutro's latest play, "John Gladys's Honor," produced last March by George Alexander at the St. James Theatre, the rights of which are controlled by James K. Hackett, for this country, has also met with great favor in England.
