Lee of the Royal Military College has received instructions from the British Government to leave, for Washington on Saturday, and proceed to Cuba with the United States troops. The English military authorities are desirous of being informed on the manoeuvres of the United States artillerymen, and have selected Capt. Lee to look after the information.

The charter of the company was granted in 1889 owing to the efforts of Mr. Rhodes, who was formerly Premier of Cape Colony.
