

Washington, Aug. 24.—The House adopted the conference report on the Anti-Beer Bill by 199 to 31.

Adrian, Mich., Aug. 24.—Mrs. M. Kirby, prominent state temperance worker, charged with the murder of a child born July 10 to her unmarried partner, was asked to revoke her plea for trial at the October term of the Circuit Court.

Panama Will Not Resist.
Washington, Aug. 24.—Panama will not resist the occupation of the disputed territory of Coco by Costa Rica, the United States Minister at Panama yesterday cabled the State Department.

Ottawa, Aug. 24.—The appeal of the Dominion government in the Grain Commission injunction case is to be argued in the court of appeal in Winnipeg September 26.

The Yukon Plebiscite Vote.
Ottawa, Aug. 24.—Yukon Territory voted "wet" in the plebiscite on liquor importation held in the Territory on July 11th. It was announced officially yesterday, by 823 to 423.

Asked to Revoke Charter.
Winnipeg, Man., Aug. 24.—The Trades and Labor Congress were yesterday asked to revoke the charter of the Canadian Brotherhood of Railway Employees and expel that organization from membership in the Congress. The matter was laid over until today.

British Census Figures.
London, Aug. 24.—The population of England, Wales and Scotland under the new census is 42,767,559 against 40,831,306 in 1911.

Successful Dirigible Trial.
Howden, England, Aug. 24.—The giant dirigible Z. R.-2, purchased by the United States government from Great Britain, which began a trial trip at 7.10 yesterday morning, was still in the air at 8 last night.

U. S.-German Peace Treaty.
Berlin, Aug. 24.—The peace treaty between the United States and Germany will be signed today.

Prince Faisal Ascends Throne.
Bagdad, Aug. 24.—Prince Faisal ascended the throne of the Iraq region here yesterday.

Railway Strike Ballots.
Cleveland, Aug. 24.—Strike ballots for submission to 400,000 members of the "Big Four" railroad brotherhoods and the Switchmen's Union of North America, were being prepared here yesterday at a conference of the five organizations, which was postponed to this morning.

Murderers in Electric Chair.
Trenton, N. J., Aug. 24.—George Brandon, who killed a young woman and her sweetheart in an automobile near Rahway, N. J., and Wm. Fitzsimmons, who murdered his wife at Woodbridge, N. J., were put to death in the electric chair at the state prison here last night.
