The interior of the new Parliament Buildings, Fredericton, is rapidly approaching completion.

Hanlan has received an offer of \$5,000 from St. Louis, Mo., to row his race with Wallace Ross here.

It is stated that the Fenian, James Stephens, is engaged as a contributor to *The Irishman*, the new Land League organ.

It is stated that work on the Panama canal has been abandoned, and that Dr. Lessey's engineers have returned to France.

A fire on the 17th inst. destroyed 25 buildings, comprising nearly the whole town of Alletown, Michigan. Sixty families are homeless. Loss \$60,000.

A New York saloon-keeper, the other day, to escape the heat, went into an ice-box, where he fell asleep, and was found the next day frozen to death.

The Irish Orangemen have enlisted 400 laborers to reap crops in the "Boycott" districts of Ireland. Sixty of the number started for Dublin on the 16th.

The lighthouse keeper at Bird Rocks, near Magdalen Islands, his son, and an assistant were killed on Saturday by the fog gun exploding a barrel of powder.

A St. Petersburg despatch to London says it is believed the Russian harvest will yield fifty per cent more than was known within the living memory of man.

A meeting of the shareholders of the Maritime Bank is called, to be held in St. John on the 27th of September to consider a proposal to have the bank resume business.

Stock in Great Britain during the last ten years has diminished more than 12 per cent. There has been decline of two million sheep and one million lambs since 1870.

A St. Louis druggist's assistant had a bad idea that the word "siphon" was Latin for an "ounce." It required two men's deaths to convince him of his mistake.

The churches of Protestant Switzerland have fixed upon January 1st, 1884, as the 400th anniversary of the birth of Zwingli, the immortal Reformer of Zurich.

Martin J. Wilkins, Prothonotary of Halifax County, died on the 16th inst. The office, which is worth \$5,000 per annum, will likely be filled by the appointment of Local Premier Holmes thereto.

Only Mr. Gladstone and two other M. P.'s are in the British House of Commons who were in it forty-four years ago when it was dissolved, on the death of William IV. They are Mr. Christopher Talbot and Mr. C. P. Villiers.

A child fell out of a car window on the Maine & St. John Railway on the evening of the 23d, and beyond two slight scalp wounds, though the train was stopping at 25 miles an hour, sustained no injury.

The newspaper Union building and two other buildings were burned at Omaha, Nebraska, on the 17th inst. Fifty papers were supplied with "patent" matches by this union. The fire will cause serious inconvenience.

Gutless a few days ago, caused a commotion in the gates of Washington by an attack on a guard who attempted to take a sharpened piece of steel from him. He was overpowered, and then accused the guards of trying to murder him.

On arriving at the end of the C. P. Railway, west about thirty-five miles beyond the Portage, the Governor-General laid a rail. Considering the limited experience he has had in laying rails, it is said that he accomplished the feat tolerably well.

The persecution of the Jews in Russia and elsewhere has led to the formation of a public subscription at Brussels in aid of these unfortunate children of the dismembered race, and it is gratifying to know that a large sum has already been collected.

Barques Victor et Eugenie (Fr.) at St. John's, Nfld., Aug. 7, reports having been boarded by the crew of the dory City of Bath, from Maine for Hare, on July 28. The dory had captured all their provisions. The V. et E. supplied them, and they resumed their voyage.

The "Lunenburg Progress" says Broad Cove claims to be the back of the town in the County. Mr. Josiah Bolivar moved five acres of land in 19 hours. The yield of hay was 12 tons. The work was done on three different days, on the farm of Enoch Teal Esq., and the total time spent at it was only 19 hours.

Arrangements are being made by the proprietors of the steamer "Royal," recently burned at Fredericton, for the construction of another in its place. It is proposed to build it at the next spring, the builder to be Mr. Samuel Thibodeau, of Portland, who also constructed the "Royal" and Fredericton to be the place of building.

A Boston firm of lumber dealers is trying the experiment of bringing Canadian lumber to that city in an immense raft, from Toronto to Oswego, by the way of the canal to Troy, next to New York, and finally around Cape Cod into Boston harbor. The raft now on route is 1,900 ft. long and 64 ft. wide, the value being \$25,000 and cost of towage \$5,500.

William Estey, of Durham settlement, York county, has sold his portion of food, seed or liquid, under his stomach for 28 days. He had previous to the time vomited nearly all the nourishment taken for six months. A physician, who called to see him on Sunday, says the man has an entire closure of the lower part of the tube leading from the mouth to the stomach, and that he must die of starvation.

A Gloucester dispatch of 16th inst., says:—The schooner "Victor," from Western Banks, reports that George Sedgwick, a brother of the captain, and his companion were returning from the trawling, when the dory capsized. The companion got upon the bottom of the dory, Sedgwick kept afloat with an oar, and had almost reached the dory when a huge shark seized him and disappeared. He was a native of Prince Edward Island, about twenty-six years of age, and is unmarried.

The Nelsonville Mountaineer says: Mr. James Brooke, cousin of our much respected former townsmen, Dr. Brooke, arrived here on the 13th inst. A few minutes after the train had passed Prescott Station, and when about one mile and a half on this side, the engine struck a dark rock, which was lying on the track, and immediately the whole train, with the exception of two first-class cars and several Pullman coaches, were hurled into the deep ditch. The driver, who had bravely kept at his post, was instantly killed. Two express messengers and the fireman were seriously injured. The passengers had a miraculous escape. The dark mass proved to be a cow, which was one of three or four then on the track.
