A SINGULAR FARM.—There is a "Farm" it can only be so-called of not less than 150 miles in length, existing in one of the most populated and best traversed parts of England. This agricultural phenomenon is in the occupancy of Mr. Brotherhood of Chippenham, and consists of the narrow strip of land forming the slopes and edges of the Great Western Railway. He has a factory at Chippenham, where he employs 300 men.—The Press.

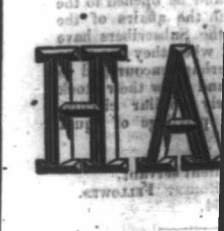
