General News.

The Quebec Legislature has been summoned for the 27th of January. The Irish Land Commission, during the past year, granted an average reduction in the price of land, of 24 per cent.

Free Trade.

The reduction of internal duties and the taking off of revenue stamps from Proprietary Medicines, no doubt has largely benefited the community, as well as relieving the burden of home manufacturers.

Says the Moncton Times: "Have a nut for the free traders to crack. Wages in the cotton factories have increased from ten to fifteen per cent. protection, and raw cotton has increased five per cent since 1873. At the same time standard shooting is twenty-five per cent cheaper now than it was in November 1, 1875.
