BY-LAW No.

By-Law to authorize the Wardens of the United Counties of Huron and Bruce, to issue Debentures in payment of the interest on the Capital Stock of the Huron and Bruce Joint Stock Railroad Company.

And whereas the Directors of the Huron and Bruce Joint Stock Railroad Company have resolved to extend the line of the Huron and Bruce Railroad from its present terminus at the Town of Goderich, in the County of Huron; and under a Resolution passed for that purpose, have authorized the subscription of fifty thousand shares of the Capital Stock of the said Company.

And whereas the Wardens of the United Counties of Huron and Bruce, in accordance with a Resolution of the Municipal Council of the said United Counties, authorizing him so to do, has and on behalf of the said United Counties, subscribed for and acquired, and the said United Counties now hold and own twenty five thousand shares of the said Capital Stock of the said Company.

And whereas it is expedient to empower the Wardens of the said United Counties, from time to time, as he shall be thereunto required by Resolution of the Municipal Council of the said United Counties, to issue and grant Debentures of the said Municipality for the sum of one hundred and twenty five thousand pounds, the price of value of the said Debentures shall be in full payment thereof, payable on the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and the said Debentures to bear interest payable semi-annually.

And whereas for the payment of the said Debentures and the interest thereon, at the period of the time for which it will be necessary for the said Municipality to raise annually a Special Rate over and above the ordinary rate, and in addition to all other Rates and Taxes now or hereafter levied, and to be levied in each year for during the period of twenty years, commencing on the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and extending to the first day of July one thousand nine hundred and two, the sum of one hundred and twenty five thousand pounds.
