Produce and Provisions.

(Frome The Trade Review.)

CODFISH.—During this week 11,-99 quintals of dry codfish were shipto foreign markets from Newndland, of this amount 9,543 qtls. were sent from St. John's and 2,456 from Burin to Halifax. The balance of he shipment went to Barbados, Liveroool, Spain, and Bahia. Some Cargoes last year's fish arrived from Plaitia Bay and other sections of the south Coasts, and the fish sold at \$9.00 to \$10.50 according to quality; only three merchants' firms here were buying this week. European markets except Portugal are over-supplied and prices have declined.

COD OIL.—The shipments of Comon Cod Oil this week totaled 15,177 gallons, of which 13,858 gallons went to Boston and 1319 gallons to North Sydney. The demand shows signs of ecrease and there is a weakening in the price that prevailed all the Spring in the United States. Local holdings of 1919 oil are now at low ebb and as the stocks are in the hands of a few exporters, the price here is keeping firm at \$10 to \$15.

CODLIVER OIL .- Preparations are now active for the manufacture of Codliver Oil amongst those who have faith in the future of this particular product. Others have an idea that it will not pay to treat their livers this way the coming summer and that it will be more profitable to let them render into common cod oil. Our own opinion is that those who have the outfit and have a reputation for manufacturing a good article of refined oil would make most money out of cod livers this season HERRING .- Mr. Redman of Red-

man Bros. Herring Packers returned from New York by the S. S. Rosalind this week and gives a very denressing report of the future outlook of the Newfoundland Herring Fishery. The Herring market in New York is practically dead and there is nothing doing in Newfoundland Herring. At present there are about 12,000 barrels of Scotch Pack in Notre Dame Bay that were held up all the winter and could not get out owing to the ice making so early and shutting off all navigation, there are also about 13,-000 barrels of Split herring between Fogo and Cape John. The firms that have been hardest hit by being debarred from getting their herring out last winter are Messrs. Strong & Murcell, Wellman, Winsor, Blackler, Ltd., Smith Shipman & Co., Ltd., Clarke & Earle. Split herring are down to about \$4 a barrel and no one in the local market cares to touch Scotch Pack at all.

LOBSTERS .- Packers will have to careful this summer in view of the regulations in Canada and the States regarding tinned Lobsters. All consignments going from Newfoundland will be subject to a rigid inspection and any cans less than 16 ozs. of fish and containing water will be thrown out and condemned. In some instances that came to light last season, the cans were half full of water and did not contain 16 ozs. of dry "meat". These two requirements will be rigidy insisted on by American and Cauadian importers of Newfoundland pack this season. The Lobster packers will therefore be guided accordingly, and as they can be traced by their license number, they will get into serious trouble if they practice any dishonesty. We understand that West Coast packers are expecting

\$35.00 per case of 48 one pound tins. PORK.—The market continues lifeless and there is no change in quotations of any consequence during the week. American Authorities are of opinion that the low spot in Hog values s about reached. They base their calculation on the fact, that, at present prices of corn, hog-raising is not a paying venture. The anticipated shortage of hogs later on is consequently a factor in the way of preventing any further important decline in prices. The present low prices have been and this will continue till financial credits are established with the countries that need Pork products so badly.
