Telescope That Tells the Time TONDERS OF THE WORLD'S MOST

For the reason that it is governed by rules forbidding admittance to any but astronomers and privileged visitors. Greenwich Observatory, which may soon be moved into more suitable surroundings, is at once the nost famous and the least known institution of its kind in the world.

Greenwich Observatory is a monument to one of the few, really wise actions of Charles II. Founded by him in 1675, for "the promotion of astronomy and navigation," it was not until many years had elapsed that the public as a whole appreciated its

A good illustration of the ignorance that prevailed was shown by the fact that when, at the time of Queen Victoria's accession, Sir George Airy was appointed Astronomer Royal, or Astronomer Observator, as the holder of the position was formerly known, he was inundated by letters addressed to "The Astrologist Royal," the writers of which begged him to cast their horoscopes, tell their fortunes, and

Incidentally, the Astronomer Royal was also pestered by cranks who sought to impress him with their theories of the earth's flatness and other far-fetched ideas. This class of letter was put away in pigeon-holes, with sub-divisions for "earth-flateners," "earth-squarers," and the rest, the whole collection being labelled "Insanity"!

Not everyone knows how Greenwich Mean Time is determined, although there is a widely-held belief that the sun is closely associated with the calculation. But the sun is by no means the safest of guides, being itself uncertain in its movements. At one season it may be ten minutes slow, while at another is may be ahead of correct time.

A check is kept at Greenwich in what is known as the Transit Room by means of a giant telescope, which can be focused on any part of the heavens when a particular star is due o cross the Greenwich meridian, or, to be more precious, at exactly when the part of the earth turning on its axis brings the telescope in alignnent with the star.

This checking process goes on onstantly, the result being sent out nourly all over the country. Errors are corrected just before 10 a.m. and p.m., but what mistakes there are seldom exceed two-tenths of a second-a remarkable testimony to the efficiency of the staff and the instru-

ments. Every day the Greenwich clock adjusted to mark accurate time, and it is this clock which now ticks in ne of every wireless listener Before the minute of time to be recorded, the preceding five seconds are heard as clicks; the time signal itself, falling on the exact zero, is heard as a louder click than the others. These clicks are the sound of the escape wheel, which is permitted to touch a spring with six successive teeth. This makes an electrical contract, which transmits a current direct to the Lon-don broadcasting station's aerial. The personal factor is thereby entirely

eliminated. One of the most curious tasks for which the official astronomers are responsible consists of "baking" the chronometers used in the Royal Navy. Every chronometer is tested at the Obsrvatory, those required on extended cruises in varying climates kept apart for two months in an oven heated to a temperature of 90 degrees. Inspection of the Observators re-

gisters, in which are entries relating to the testing of chronometers over Phone 1559 many years, sheds sidelights on more than one famous episode.
