The imports into Guelph of all kinds for the month of January, 1872, are 2,697,518 lbs.—freight \$2, 974.97; imports for January, 1871, 1,271,923 lbs.—freight \$1,555.39—thus showing the extraordinary increase of 1,418,596 lbs. in one month. This

increase is mainly in grain, dressed hogs and general goods.

The number of passengers who left Guelph in January, 1872, are 2,-222; for the month of January, 1871, 1,760, showing an increase of 462, and representing in money an increase

of \$725.10. A paragraph has lately been going the rounds of the papers to the effect that the trade of Guelph had greatly fallen off. The above figures will show that the report is totally unfounded. Guelph, in spite of the railroads north, continues to hold its own and a little more.


