AT WORK ON SOME NEW LEGISLATION

Railway Men Drafting Program For The Protection of Themselves.

[Canadian Press.] Ottawa, Jan. 8.—Some of the chief representatives of the six great railway brotherhoods are in session here drafting a program of legislation designed to protect railwaymen from being submitted to the Government for consideration at the next session of Parliament.

Amongst the representatives attending the meetings are Calvin Lawrence, of Ottawa; Ash Kennedy and W. B. Best, of Winnipeg, representing the locomotive engineers; W. L. Best, of Ottawa, and George K. Wark, of Toronto, of the locomotive firemen; J. Harvey Hall, of Ottawa, of the railway conductors; John Maloney, of Ottawa; J. Cook, of Moose Jaw, and A. G. Gorman, of Toronto, of the trainmen; David Campbell and G. D. Robertson, of Toronto, representing the railway telegraphers, and A. B. Lowe, of Cleveland, of the maintenance of way employees.

The meetings will extend over two or three days, and not until the program to be drafted is definitely settled will it be made public.

CLEVER CAPTURE BY WINNIPEG POLICE

Stolen Arms and Ammunition Secured From Four Suspects Arrested.

[Canadian Press.] Winnipeg, Jan. 8.—In a sensational series of raids carefully planned and cleverly executed by the police, practically all the large quantities of arms and ammunition stolen from the Hingston-Smith Arms Company by burglars early Saturday morning were recovered last night, and four men, thought to have been connected with the robberies, are under arrest. In addition, a lot of loot, identified as having been taken from other places entered lately, was recovered.

GODERICH YOUNG MAN CHARGED WITH THEFT

He Pleaded Guilty To Taking Neighbor's Turkeys—Sent For Trial

[Special to The Advertiser.] Goderich, Jan. 8.—Information laid before William Bailey, magistrate of Duncannon, by John Hutchinson, of Port Albert, charging Victor Whitney and John Gauley, neighbors, with stealing turkeys, was tried in the town hall this morning. Both young men are of very respectable families. Gauley pleaded guilty. They were sent up for trial, and let out on \$400 bail.

FATHER AND SON MOVEMENT POPULAR

[Canadian Press.] Cleveland, Jan. 8.—Robert E. Lewis, secretary of the Cleveland Young Men's Christian Association, who originated the "father and son" movement, has received letters from the mayors of more than 100 cities, stating that they have issued proclamations calling upon citizens to participate in the movement to draw fathers and their sons into closer union.

"Father and son" movements have been formally launched in many American cities.

LANDED ON ROOF, BUT ESCAPED UNINJURED

French Aviator Nearly Victim of Fatal Accident With Army Monoplane

Paris, Jan. 8.—Eugene Gilbert, the French aviator, narrowly escaped death while flying over Paris today, when he descended on a roof of a tile factory, through which his aeroplane broke and was wrecked.

Gilbert was making a trial trip in a new army monoplane, carrying a heavy load. He was attempting to glide to earth, but descended too quickly. The aviator escaped injury.

STRIKE SETTLEMENT NOW WITHIN SIGHT

Montreal Garment Workers and Employees Agree To Arbitration

[Canadian Press.] Montreal, Jan. 8.—The long standing strike among the garment workers of the city is within view of a settlement. The strikers have come to an agreement with the employers to submit all their differences to a board of arbitration appointed, one member by the strikers, one member by the employers, and Reuben Brainin, editor of the Jewish Eagle, as chairman.

BEATEN FOR MAYORALTY SEEKS COUNCIL HONORS

[Canadian Press.] Ottawa, Jan. 8.—J. A. Ellis, M.L.A. for West Ottawa, who on Monday last was defeated for the mayoralty, will seek re-election to the city council as an alderman. Wm. Findlay, elected in Central ward, today resigned his seat to create the vacancy.

THE DISPOSAL OF TELEPHONE STOCK

Plans Being Considered by G. C. Todd, Who Will Oppose Pro Rata Distribution.

[Canadian Press.] Washington, January 8.—Preliminary plans for the disposition by the so-called telephone trust of its \$29,000,000 worth of Western Ontario stock were under consideration today by G. C. Todd, assistant to Attorney General McReynolds in charge of prosecutions under the Sherman anti-trust act.

Although the present negotiations have not reached the stage where the policy can be outlined, it is known that Attorney General McReynolds and Mr. Todd will oppose a pro rata distribution of the Western Union shares among stockholders of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company.

Although a final decision may not be reached for many weeks, the department of justice probably will adhere to its announced policy of allowing the American Company as much time as is necessary to dispose of the Western Union stock without loss to its own stockholders.

HIGH COURT TO TRY DUCHESS' APPEAL

[Canadian Press.] Rome, Jan. 8.—Cardinal Vincenzo Vanutelli, as prefect of the Segnatura tribunal, has called a meeting of the High Court for Saturday next to decide the appeal of the Duchess De Talleyrand, formerly Anna Gould, from the verdict of the Rota Tribunal annulling her marriage to Count Boni de Castellane.

If the High Court rejects her contention, the next decision of the Rota Tribunal will be final, otherwise it will be still possible to have the case reviewed.

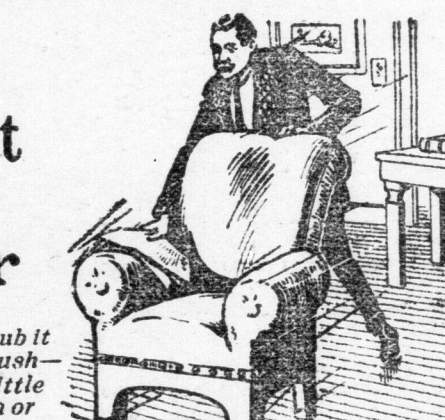
