A Band of Outlaws Enterminated.

Kansas City, Mo., Sept. 2.—A special from Paladora, in the public land strip, says the farms and herdsmen of that section who had lost many horses and cattle recently, suspected a band of campers, and finding syldence of guilt, forty well-armed vigilantes surrounded the campidation and sent in a committee of six men to demand the surrender of the thieves. The reply of the desperadoes was a volley, which wounded one man and two horses. This angered the vigilantes, and firing was at once begun and the outlaws shot down without mercy. They fought desperately, and no quarter was asked or given. In twelve minutes firing ceased, and seventeen outlaws were found to have been killed. The vigilantes had three men killed and nine wounded. Two horses were also killed and sevent wounded.

Hitherto the question of amending the provisions of the convention of 1818, or aiming at a different interpretation of these provisions has been only for diplomatic correspondence and communications. The results of diplomacy have, as every one knows, been nullified entirely by the action of the Senate at Washington. It is hoped, however to resume negotiations with the States after the November elections, for it would seem almost useless to attempt to accomplish anything before then.
