NOT YET RELEASED.

Application for Discharge of Capias Meets With Defeat.

Mr. John K. Rice, late manager of the Imperial Stock Company, is still enjoying the hospitality of Deputy Sheriff Siddall. An application was made to Mr. Justice Drake, sitting in Chambers yesterday morning, to have the capias discharged, the ground taken being that the affidavit was not direct evidence as to the cause of the action, and did not disclose sufficient reason for the granting of a capias. Mr. Prior, for Messrs. Eberts & Taylor's office, appeared for Mr. Rice, and the application, while Mr. Ramsay, (Miss Esther Lyons on the stage), was represented by Mr. H. D. Helmeke, acting for Mr. E. V. Bodwell. The application was refused, having been fully gone into before Mr. Justice Drake. Mr. Helmeke suggested, in support of the capias, that Mr. Justice Crease having issued it, he was the proper person to consider and deal with the application for its discharge.

Judge Crease, being found in his Chambers, consented to hear the application, and having heard both sides, he decided that the reasons had been shown to cause him to alter his opinion that a capias should issue. Mr. Prior announced his intention of applying for a writ of habeas corpus, and Mr. Rice remains in custody, unless he secures bonds satisfactory to the sheriff. Miss Lyons' action for breach of contract cannot come to trial for several weeks.
